LEATHERHEAD AND DISTRICT
ELECTRICITY (EXTENSION).

NOTICE is hereby given that the Leatherhead and District Electricity Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") and whose registered offices are at New Broad Street House, in the city of London, are applying to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1922 for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the area of the Company for the supply of electricity as defined by the Leatherhead and District Electric Lighting Orders 1902 to 1913 (hereinafter called "the existing Orders") so as to include the parishes of East Horsley, West Horsley and East Clandon, all in the rural district of Guildford, in the county of Surrey, and so much of the parish of Chessington, in the rural district of Epsom in the said county, as lies to the south of an imaginary line drawn across the parish in a south easterly direction from a point on the boundary of the parish of Hook three hundred and fifty feet north of the northern boundary of Fair Oak Lane to a point on the boundary of the Urban District of Epsom three hundred and fifty feet north of the northern boundary of Russet Lane, and to enable the Company to exercise within the aforesaid parishes and part of parish (hereinafter called "the added area") with or without modification, all or some of the powers exercisable by them within their existing area of supply, including the powers to break up streets and roads, and levying and recovering rates, rents, and charges for the supply of electricity and meters and apparatus used in the consumption of electricity, and all the powers that may be acquired by them under the Order.

2. To authorise the Company to break up the following streets and parts of streets, including bridges not repairable by the local authority, and railways, viz.:—

(a) Streets and bridges:—

In the parish of East Horsley:—

Roads on Horsley Station estate including Cobham Way leading from the Ripley Road into Cobham and Effingham Road, road from the Effingham and Cobham Road past Norrell's Lodge, roads on Horsley Park Estate, including The Warren, The Approach to Horsley Station, the road running North from Guildford Road to Fangate Cottages, the road running West from Bishops Gate to Manor Farm House, the roadways on the bridges carrying the Cobham and Effingham Road and the road at Effingham Station over the Southern Railway and the foot bridge over the Southern Railway at the Forest.

Parish of West Horsley:—

The road from Guildford Road via Wix Farm, Tunmore Farm to junction of West Horsley Road, the road from Ripley Lane to Rectory, the road from Cranmore Lane joining West Horsley Road opposite School, Green Lane West, the road from Lower
